- 8 Reports Cornwall Council Report by Cllr Mrs E Hannaford:
- 8.1 Cllr Hannaford provided a written brief in advance of the meeting and members' questions.
- 8.2 **Public Toilets** Members of the Public Toilet working group briefed members on a meeting Cllr Duffin (CC) to address a number of outstanding issues with the transfer of the public toilets. After further discussion members decided that it would be in the best interests of the parish to take over full operation of the toilets at Crumplehorne and Fishnabridge by entering into a Tenancy at Will with Cornwall Council early in the new year. This would allow full control of the facilities whilst a number of other issues were worked out with Cornwall Council and the Land Registry. Members of the PC Working group, assisted by the Clerk, would prepare a tender document for publication when a date was agreed with Cornwall Council.
 - 0316 RESOLVED to enter into Tenancy at Will for the Public Conveniences at Crumplehorne and Fishnabridge effective 1 Feb 2017 or as early thereafter as is possible.
 - o Proposed by Cllr. Lightfoot, seconded by Cllr Leftly, resolution carried
- **9** Traffic Regulation Order The TRO is now almost fully implemented with some administrative work still to be completed at Brent. Members expressed disappointment that several local persons regularly ignored the parking restrictions at certain times. PCC will seek to address this with CC Parking Enforcement.
- **10 Neighbourhood Plan** Members were briefed on the progress of the NDP. Questionnaires had been sent to all households and businesses in the Parish with a closing date of 12th December. To date, 25% of adult parishioners had responded.

Whilst not considered an ideal response by the NDP team this was much better than the average achieved in other areas. Analysis of the responses would now take place before incorporation into the outline plan.

- 11 Traffic Regulation Order Members were informed that a Cornwall Council Civil Enforcement officer was willing to meet with the Council to discuss enforcement issues. The Clerk would investigate potential times and dates and advise members accordingly.
- 12 Big Green Project Members of the working group had been unable to establish a consensus on the overall design. Notwithstanding this, it was agreed that the plan needed to be taken forward to planning application stage. The Clerk was to arrange a meeting with the Architect, preferably before the next Council meeting, to explore how this should best be achieved.
- **13 Government Post Office Consultation** Cllr Greville briefed Members on a Government consultation that was taking place on the future structure of the Post Office, then abstained from further discussion and the vote (declared interest). PCC were otherwise unanimous in support of the essential nature of this service in rural areas such as Lansallos parish. Clerk to respond before closing date.
 - 0317 RESOLVED to respond to the Government consultation in support of retention of rural Post Offices.
